
A lot will be expected of them (grandaunts), they are few but they are a great group, they have what it takes to measures up to the high expectations of the government and the society at large.

BACKGROUND OF JUBA INSTITUTE OF HEALTH SCIENCES

JIHS is a private health Institute not for profit established on 21 August 2014, with the aim of training health professionals who would be the backbone for quality health services delivery in South Sudan and beyond, it goes without a saying that our existence will go a long way in addressing the worst health indicators the country has in the world and extremely low health care coverage caused by a shortage of functioning health facilities and a lack of skilled health professionals, the life expectancy at birth is 54 years, the under-five infant mortality rate is 106 per 1000, while maternal mortality rate is the highest in the world at 2054 per 100000 live births, South Sudan remains one of the poorest and least developed in the world where less than 44% of the population have access to basic services (Health sector development plan 2011-2015), severe shortage in all categories of trained health professionals including physicians (1 per 65,574 population) and midwives (1 per 39,088 population), therefore a training of different cadres is the only remedy for improving the poor health indicators above. Our enrolment is at 1000 from different cadres of clinical officers, Pharmacy technicians, Laboratory technicians, nursing and midwifery with majority being clinical officers and the least being midwives.

you can recall in 2014 on 8th October, while in your office before the panel of ministry of health, when I was presenting a proposal on Juba Institute of health sciences seeking your blessings and approval it was like imagination and a day dreaming, given the fact that it was during the time the war of 2013 and its consequences were at its peak,

But thank God from that time, up to date we miraculously got over hills and mountains of challenges, fails and rises at a blink of an eye, moving on our feeble legs of infancy in order to arrive at today's occasion and as we talk we have an enrolment of up to 500 plus not only for clinical medicine but also , midwifery, nursing, pharmacy technician etc. and we have attracted students from Kenya, Uganda, Congo, Sudan and in our January admission we admitted a Nigerian , therefore, within our first 3 years we have not only trained students from South Sudan but beyond borders.

Furthermore, permits me to thank their team of dedicated consultants, teaching and non-teaching staffs whose support, knowledge and skills had shaped this graduates into well competent health professionals who would serve not only South Sudanese communities but they rest of the communities in other parts of the world.

May I bring to your notice Guest of honor sir, that the efforts of this great team paid off, when our school emerges with 100% passes in the recent national health professional examination board set by the ministry of health republic of South Sudan, as being our first time to sit that was marvelous and splendid indeed, it was not a miracle but due to team work of this great patriotic staffs who deserves accolades and national medal for great job well done.

I am yet confuse whom to thank and not to thank, when the list is endless, think of the teams of Juba teaching hospital, Military hospital, AlSabah Children Hospital, The PHCCs in the likes of Nyakuron, Munuki, Gurei etc, nor do we forget the efforts of states hospitals and other private health care providers who allows hands on for students while still endeavoring in their pursuit of competence skills and above all thanks your initiatives of supporting us in one way or the other honourable minister with your demoted team led by undersecretary Dr Makur and DG for training and professional development Dr Michael making thanks and God blesses you and ingrained your names in the minds and hearts of South Sudanese now to infinity, and live to sing in their lips and narrates to their offspring that there was once a devoted minister of health by name Dr Riek Gai Kok that outlived they rest in the history of health services delivery in this country.

When we opened and operated this institution three years ago, our original idea was not to make profits nor did we want to be driving the V8s, build and live in storey buildings, be famous etc. but we felt it was a call to serve our fellow citizens and together lay a foundation along sides other established public health institutions that were overwhelmed by increasing pressure of increase rate of production of health works who were and still like a drop of an oil in an ocean at every exerted efforts of production.

You may not believe me when I correctly say what each clinical officer graduate on this graduating gown today paid cumulatively as a tuition fees from the word go in 2015 up to date was a total of 28,000ssp (equivalent of 140 USD) for the whole of three years, but our pay is when this graduates reduce the high maternal mortality rate, High infant mortality rate, disease burden among our community etc.

My advice to graduates is to leave following money and politics, but they should follow people services who are dying of preventable diseases

Infrastructural development at Juba Institute of Health Sciences

We started by renting our first Premises in 2015, but now we have put up our own infrastructures funded by the students' fees collection

1st Infrastructural development started with extension of the then open space for assembly to a third classroom in our first premises in 2016

2nd Infrastructural development Laying of a foundational Pillars for 5G-Floor on 1st October 2017 and this major project funded through student tuition fees is expected to complete by 2020

3rd Infrastructural development was a building of a three classroom block at our neighbor's Premises to meet the expanding demand of a space by exponential growth of a population which project started in June and ended in August 2018 that year.

Future plans and projections

We have plan in place to be transformed into a private University for Sciences and Technology in South Sudan and the region by year 2022

We have a plan in place to build the leading private modern hospital in South Sudan

We have plan in place to put up more infrastructures for accommodation, lectures hall and demonstration blocks.

Opportunity cost for foundation of JIHS

The founder Dr Isaac Ayii Ayii, PhD had to forgo jobs with NGOs, UN agencies and government agencies despite being on market by that time in order for him to establish JIHS in 2014

Reallocation of his family from Kampala to the suburb of Juba, Hai Referendum in order to put all resources for the establishment of JIHS

CHRONOLOGICAL HISTORY FOR FOUNDATION OF JIHS

On **7TH January 2005**, The idea for the formation of Institute was first conceived by Dr Isaac Ayii Ayii, PhD , current executive Director and The founder of JIHS, while he was on orientation day having being the best among the 40 selected candidates out of over 5000 interviewee for then new Sudan under SPLA/M for AMREF scholarship for Clinical Officers training at Maridi National Health Training Institute, he though critically that one day he would open a private institution which will cater for the surplus who could make it under a private sponsorship.

In **March 2014**, Period for naming of Institute here the founder brain stormed on naming of Institution while at Makerere University at first he thought of naming it as St Mary's Institute of Health Sciences but with consultation with his colleague particularly immediate friend Ndhego Ramadhan who was a Muslim himself advised him to drop the name St. Mary's Institute of Health Sciences which he had wanted to reflect his former ordinary level secondary school under Torit diocese by then in the name St.Mary's Minor Seminary Kocoa at Adjumani District in Uganda for a neutral one and later through thorough consultation he settled for name Juba Institute of Health Sciences having confirmed from his former colleague and a friend from Maridi National Health Training Institute by name Tobijo Denis Sokiri who was in Juba by then so that there was no any name collusion and particularly that of Health Sciences Training Institute -Juba being the oldest existing institute prior to independent of the republic of South Sudan in 2011.

From **April Up to June 2014**, The period for paper work e.g Framing of Vision, Mission, Motto, Core Values , Over all aim and Specific objectives were set up by the founder besides writing a business plan for Juba Institute of health Sciences before moving from Kampala to Juba having completed his studies at Makerere university by then.

On **21 August 2014**, the Institute name was registered by Ministry of Justice with the name Juba Institute of Health Sciences with certificate of incorporation number Hence marking the birth of Juba Institute of Health Sciences as an independent entity which can sue and be sued under the laws of republic of South Sudan.

On **14th October 2014** The letter of no Objection was written by the Ministry of Health Republic of South Sudan for the operation of Juba Institute of Health Sciences as a private health institute to train the mid-level cadres under abled leadership of Hon. Dr Riek Gai Kok, National Minister of health whose mission and vision was to scale up the production of mid-level cadres in the republic of South Sudan as the best way to deliver health services in the war devastated state that was by three years old after achieving its independence on 9th July 2011.

On **5th November 2014**, the first advertisement for January 2015 Intake was made on The Juba Telegraph a daily new paper where the founder was a columnist publishing articles on Public Health preventives measures in a column known as "National Health Concern" besides posting on his personal Facebook wall.

On **8th and 9th February 2015**, First written and oral interview for the shortlisted 51 candidates for the course of Clinical officers was conducted at current main building of institute and at a city medical center.

On **12th February 2015**, First lecture for theory classes commence for 40 selected Clinical officers Intake 1 students, starting with the nine subjects namely; Anatomy and Physiology 1 by Dr Isaac Ayii Ayii, Nutrition and First aid by Tobijo Denis Sokiri, Communication Skills by Emmanuel Monychol Akop, Medical Ethics and Nursing 1 by Alor Biong Alor, PHC by Guma Abraham, Computer Skills by Oketch Aldo and Socio-psychology by Aleu Garang Aleu for first semester , first year for Diploma in Clinical Medicine and Public Health by Ministry of health Republic of South Sudan.

On **3rd May 2015**, First Clinical Placement was done at Alsabah Children Hospital for 30 students before the closure of 1st semester with examination
